

# Course

## Description

The MMCN presents its 8th Annual Conference: Resiliency & Reintegration – Life in Transition. Nancy Sherman, distinguished professor of philosophy at Georgetown University, will deliver the keynote on moral injury. To follow, a panel of veterans and community members will share their experiences of using the humanities as a mechanism for transition. Dozens of military service providers will be present to provide resources and opportunities. Veteran Service Officers will be on-site to help service members, veterans, and family members connect to benefits and services for which they may be eligible. Awards will be presented to deserving individuals and groups who exemplify best practices and dedicated service to Maine service members, veterans and their families.

During a full hot lunch at noon, the Maine Military & Community Leadership Council will hold its annual meeting. Resource providers also will be present to talk about their services and provide materials. Attendees can choose from topics in the afternoon including: behavioral health; community building; employment successes and challenges; legal/medical; and transportation.

In the evening from 5 to 6 p.m, at the Klahr Center, UMA Augusta, VetTalkX will feature Veterans sharing personal stories of inspiration and accomplishments since leaving the military.

- Engage civilian communities into the reintegration of veterans and service members
- Increase the awareness among service members, veterans, and providers of issues and opportunities related to the well-being of those who have served in the military

# Keynote Presenter

## Nancy Sherman

Nancy Sherman is University Professor and Professor of Philosophy at Georgetown University. She has affiliate appointments at the Center on National Security and the Law at Georgetown University Law Center and at Georgetown's Kennedy Institute of Ethics. From 1997-1999, she served as inaugural holder of the Distinguished Chair in Ethics at the U.S. Naval Academy, designing the brigade-wide military ethics course and the Stockdale Center for Ethical Leadership. She has research training in psychoanalysis from the Washington Psychoanalytic Institute and regularly consults with military and veterans groups in the U.S. and abroad on issues of ethics, moral injury, and post-traumatic stress.

Her books include "Afterwar" (2015), "The Untold War" (2010), "Stoic Warriors" (2005), "Making a Necessity of Virtue" (1997), "The Fabric of Character" (1989), and "Critical Essays on the Classics: Aristotle's Ethics," editor (Rowman and Littlefield, 1999). She is the author of more than 60 articles in ethics; ancient and Stoic ethics; military ethics; Kantian ethics; the emotions; moral psychology; and psychoanalysis. She received her B.A. magna cum laude with honors from Bryn Mawr College and her Ph.D. from Harvard. She holds an M.Litt. from the University of Edinburgh. She was an assistant and associate professor at Yale, and has held teaching positions at Johns Hopkins and U. of Maryland.
